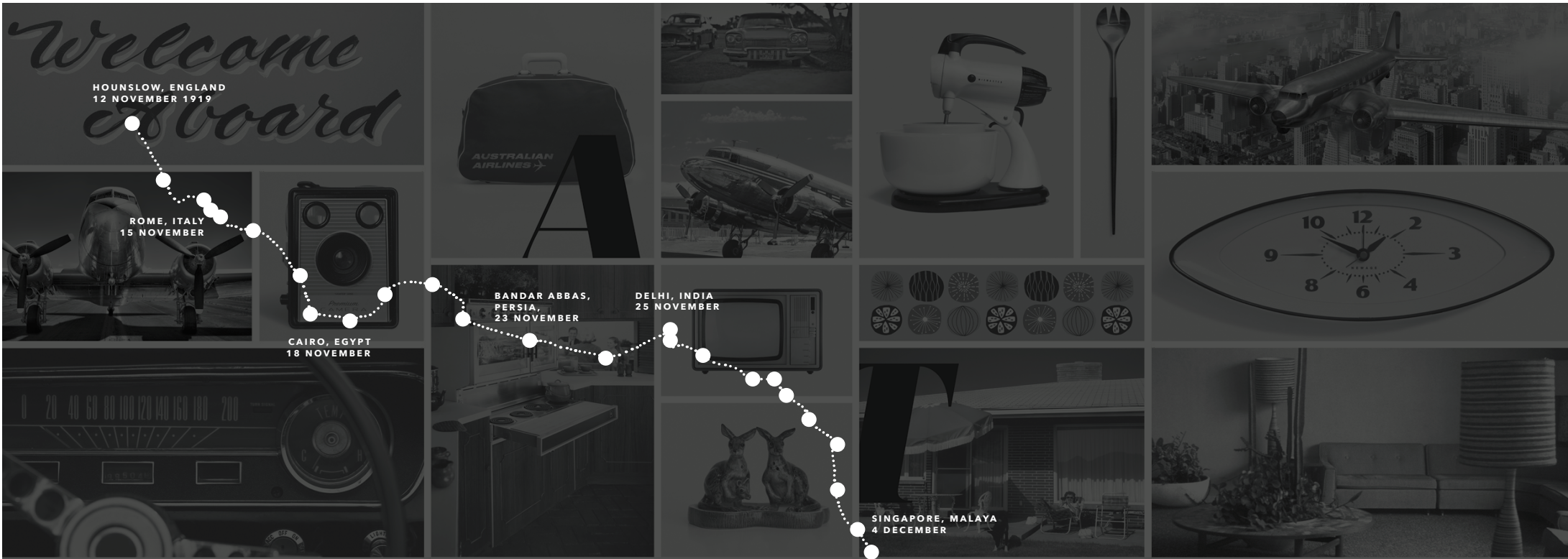

Vickers Vimy

HOUNSLOW, ENGLAND - ADELAIDE, AUSTRALIA
12 November - 10 December 1919

The crew
Born in South Australia, brothers Ross and Keith Smith served as airmen in World War One. Ross had flown heavy bombers in the Middle East and was one of the few pilots at the time with long range flying experience, while Keith had navigation training. Making up the Vimy crew were two mechanics who also had war experience: South Australian Wally Shiers and Victorian Jim Bennett.

The race
The race was Australian Prime Minister W.H "Billy Hughes" idea. He offered a prize on behalf of the Australia Government of £10,000 for the first Aussie airmen to fly from London to Darwin. This was the equivalent of \$780,000 today. Of six competing crews in the race, only two reached Australia. The Vimy crew on 10 December 1919 in 27 days and 20 hours was the first.

The journey
This was the first flight from the Great Britain to Australian, flown in a time unbeaten for 10 years. The route east of India was largely unsurveyed, and the Smiths had no in-flight contact with the ground and only a compass with which to navigate. It was an extraordinary feat of skill and endurance. The flight proved that linking far distant reaches of the globe by air transport was possible.
